

NATIONAL PET FOOD BANK

With the support of our Members across the country we launched resources to BOOST access to pet food banking.





Promising Practices

Supported the launch of a program to expand access to Humane Education resources for men and boys, aiming to reduce gender-based violence.



Members directly benefit by participating in the committee and piloting the program in their shelters with external review and evaluation

PET INCLUSIVE HOUSING



We collaborated with members to highlight the importance of petinclusive housing to the government, aiming to reduce shelter intake.

- ✓ Convened a 4-member working group
- Parliamentary petition which received 19,579 signatures!
- Contributed to the consultation for Housing, Communities and Infrastructure Canada's Canadian Renters' Bill of Rights.
- Submitted a policy paper on the impacts of pet restrictions on communities, shelters, and animals.

Federal Blueprint for a Renters' Bill of Rights recognized pet ownership as a potential discriminatory practice and urged provinces to promote accessible rental housing.

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS, RESPONSE AND RECOVERY

We Covened 3 Members and 1 Associate to elevate animal welfare and protection in federal Emergency Management

- **✓** Participated in the federal Roundtable on Civilian response
- Submitted 15 recommendations to improve Animal Response to government on advancing a Pan-Canadian Civilian Response Capacity
- Presented to the Canadian Association of Fire Chiefs with 3 Members Societies on how to improve connection between Animal Response and Fire Departments
- Signed an MOU with the Red Cross to increase information, resources and response for animals during emergencies.



Federal ag gag laws and secured an amendment to Bill C-275



That would include anyone entering a farm property who could expose animals to toxic substances or disease as a better reflection of biosecurity.



Lobbied for the Inclusion of animal protections under TWO OF THREE patterns of coercive and controlling conduct in Bill C-332,
